PRIORITY LIMITATIONS: Continuing/returning (sat out a term) students will lose their priority:

- If they earn 100/+ degree applicable credits at Cuesta College, excludes Foster Youth See Priority 6.
- If on two consecutive terms of probation status under Academic Standing policies, excludes Foster Youth See Priority 6.
- If a comprehensive student education plan (CSEP) is not completed before reaching 15 credits completed See Priority 6.

## SPECIAL CATEGORY REGISTRATION PRIORITY 1 AND 2

myCuesta REGISTRATION ACCESS BEGINS:

\* New, Transfer, and Returning (sat out a term) students must complete <u>orientation</u> and an abbreviated <u>SEP</u> or are placed in Priority 6.

Continuing students must complete Comprehensive SEP prior to completing 15 credits at Cuesta or are placed in Priority 6.

Exempt students, with an AA/AS degree or higher, must also complete all activities to qualify for early priority to register.

Excludes Dual Enrollment/Enrichment Students - See Priority 7.

\* PRIORITY 1: VETERANS/FOSTER YOUTH/CALWORKS/DSPS/EOPS/HOMELESS YOUTH

Eligible students in these programs:

- Wednesday, April 28, 8 a.m.
- Armed Forces of the United States, member or former member who is a resident of
  California, received an honorable discharge, a general discharge, or an other than honorable discharge,
  and any member or former member of the State Military Reserve, for any academic term attended at a
  CSU, UC or CCC, for four academic years after they have left state or federal active duty, which they
  shall use within 15 years of leaving state/federal active duty;
- CalWORKS (California Work Opportunity and Responsibility to Kids) or Tribal TANF recipients;
- DSPS (Disabled Student Program & Services);
- EOPS (Extended Opportunity Programs & Services);
- Foster Youth and former foster youth in California whose dependency was established or continued by
  the court on or after the youth's 16th birthday and is no older than 25 years of age at the commencement
  of the academic year. This includes foster youth who are enrolled as dual enrollment (Enrichment)
  students:
- Homeless Youth, under 25 years of age, who has been verified during the 24 months immediately
  preceding the receipt of his or her admission application, as defined in subsection (2) of Section 725 of
  the federal McKinney-Vento Homeless Assistance Act (42 U.S.C. Sec. 11434a(2)).

#### \* PRIORITY 2: SPECIAL PROGRAMS Friday, April 30, 8 a.m.

Students must meet specific program eligibility criteria as determined by each program.

- Degree/Transfer Applicants: Continuing students, with 12 credits completed at Cuesta, who will be
  completing their remaining AA, AS, Transfer (AA-T and AS-T) degree or transfer certification
  requirements within one semester at Cuesta. Students will receive this priority one time and need to
  apply for a AA, AS, Transfer (AA-T and AS-T) degree by the deadline of: March 18, 2021;
- Intercollegiate Athletes: New first-time/transfer, and incoming Intercollegiate athletes who will be
  participating in Intercollegiate sports at Cuesta not to exceed 3 years;
- DSPS Notetakers;
- Re-entry Program;
- Facilitated Assisted Learning (FAL) Facilitators;
- ASCC Leaders.
- Cuesta Student Employees;
- Cuesta Employees: Staff and faculty pursuing Professional Growth, dependent children up to the age of 25 (with the exception of Dual Enrollment students), spouses, and domestic partners of faculty or staff.

#### **CONTINUING STUDENT REGISTRATION PRIORITY 3**

A continuing student is one who is enrolled after the second week of, or received a grade, in the previous Spring 2021 term.

Excludes Dual Enrollment/Enrichment Students - See Priority 7.

Eligibility: Continuing Cuesta College students in good academic standing, who have completed a comprehensive Student Education Plan (SEP), based on the total number of course credits completed at Cuesta College. (Excludes Spring 2021 work-in-progress credits.)

#### PRIORITY 3.2: 24 - 47.9 CREDITS COMPLETED AT CUESTA

Eligibility: Continuing Cuesta College students in good academic standing, who have completed a comprehensive Student Education Plan (SEP), based on the total number of course credits completed at Cuesta College. (Excludes Spring 2021 work-in-progress credits.)

Tuesday, May 4, 8 a.m.

#### PRIORITY 3.3: 15 - 23.9 CREDITS COMPLETED AT CUESTA

Eligibility: Continuing Cuesta College students in good academic standing, who have completed a comprehensive Student Education Plan (SEP), based on the total number of course credits completed at Cuesta College. (Excludes Spring 2021 work-in-progress credits.)

## PRIORITY 3.4: 0 - 14.9 CREDITS COMPLETED AT CUESTA

Eligibility: Continuing Cuesta College students in good academic standing based on the total number of course credits completed at Cuesta College. (Excludes Spring 2021 work-in-progress credits.)

#### **PRIORITY 4: COUGAR WELCOME DAYS**

(Excludes Enrichment)

Open to new First-Time College Freshman, including Cuesta Promise SLO County students, starting at Cuesta for the 2021-2022 academic year. Cougar Welcome Days is an entirely self-paced experience that provides new first-time college students with the necessary skills to build their fall schedule and future schedules to achieve their educational goal. To participate, complete required steps then register for a virtual group appointment with a Cuesta Academic Counselor.

#### PRIORITY 5: NEW / TRANSFER / RETURNING STUDENTS

(Excludes Enrichment)

New/transfer/returning (sat out one term) matriculated student. Returning student must be in good standing with less than 100 degree applicable credits completed at Cuesta.

## myCuesta REGISTRATION ACCESS BEGINS:

Wednesday, May 19, 8 a.m. Must be a matriculated student by completing online orientation with abbreviated student education plan. In myCuesta, go to Student Registration Services and click on "Check Registration Status" to confirm completion of matriculation activities.

#### **PRIORITY 6: ALL STUDENTS**

(Excludes Enrichment)

- Non-matriculated new, transfer, or returning student.
- Continuing or returning student, excluding Foster Youth, with 100 or more degree applicable Cuesta credits.
- Continuing or returning student, excluding Foster Youth, on two terms of academic/progress probation.
- Continuing student, with 15 credits completed, without a Comprehensive Student Education Plan (SEP).

#### Wednesday, May 26, 8 a.m.

#### PRIORITY 7: ENRICHMENT (DUAL ENROLLMENT)

Enrichment Students, concurrently enrolled in grades 6-12, who have completed the admission application, Permit to Enroll, and have met all course prerequisites/age restrictions, are eligible to enroll during this time up to 11.0 credits maximum.

Pupils in grades 6-9 may attend if certified as highly gifted, 150 IQ, by school district. Contact Enrollment Services.

Thursday, May 27, 8 a.m.
